



Jiarifaralima - when the forest is reborn in Bobakilandy

On the heights of Bobakilandy, a vast private plot of land once stretched out, bare and dry. Its owner, Jiarifaralima, saw no point in planting trees there. For him, the land should remain as it was: free, empty, barren perhaps, but without constraints.
