

## Reforestation integrated into local life



Annual Report 2025

Dear friends, partners and supporters,

As I write these lines, the voluntary sector is going through a period of profound turmoil.

Environmental NGOs, and more broadly those committed to the common good, are facing a host of difficulties: dwindling public funding, the withdrawal or disengagement of certain major states from international programmes to combat climate change, tougher administrative and accounting constraints, growing mistrust of charitable actions, and a decline in tax incentives for donations.

Furthermore, only 2% of all global charitable funds are devoted to environmental projects.

We are familiar with this context.  
We sometimes suffer from it.  
But it does not discourage us.

Because at Graine de Vie, we have a deep conviction: our efforts are more necessary than ever.



For many years, Graine de Vie has been working to reforest Africa, with an approach that is both our strength and our uniqueness: reforestation integrated into local life, designed not only to restore ecosystems, but also to tangibly improve the well-being and livelihood of local communities.

Reforestation cannot be disconnected from human realities.

Planting trees also means planting hope, dignity and prospects for the future.

Every day, our teams work alongside rural communities in the field.

We provide free forest trees and income-generating trees (fruit trees, food trees, trees that generate income) to strengthen food security, improve economic resources and empower people to live sustainably on their land. In doing so, we are now reaching hundreds of thousands of people, who are becoming the actors and guardians of this reforestation.



Our presence in nine African countries, our 376 nurseries, our national park protection and mangrove restoration programmes, and our vast large-scale reforestation project in the Democratic Republic of Congo — with the ambitious goal of restoring 10,000 hectares — are testament to how far we have come.

But beyond the numbers, it is the faces, smiles and pride of the villagers that give meaning to our work.

In many regions, populations suffer from the consequences of environmental degradation, which they have sometimes contributed to out of necessity, due to a lack of alternatives.

Climate change, desertification, soil depletion and the increasing scarcity of natural resources are now hitting them hard.

By giving them access to trees again and supporting them with sustainable programmes, we are reconciling them with nature and rebuilding a vital bond based on responsibility, transmission and the long term. The increasingly uncertain macroeconomic and political landscape is weakening organisations such as ours, even though we operate close to communities with proven efficiency and measurable impact.



But our determination remains intact.

It draws its strength from the professionalism, commitment and courage of our local teams, who often work in difficult conditions with limited resources, but with remarkable energy and skill. It is also fuelled by the trust and enthusiasm of village communities, who welcome our programmes with gratitude and become our best ambassadors. Finally, it relies on the loyal support of our partners and donors, without whom none of this would be possible.



In a world sometimes tempted by withdrawal, renunciation or short-termism, Graine de Vie continues to believe in the power of concrete, patient and humane actions.

We believe that making the earth greener also makes women and men happier.

We believe that every tree planted is a promise made to future generations.

We believe that ecology cannot be separated from social justice and human development.

Despite the headwinds, we are moving forward. In difficult times, we contribute every year to improving the lives of hundreds of thousands of people and restoring entire territories.

We are sowing, both literally and figuratively, the seeds of a more resilient, more united and more respectful future.

On behalf of the entire Graine de Vie team, I would like to warmly thank those who accompany us, support us and believe in our mission.

Together, let us continue to grow this forest of hope.

# OUR ACTIONS

## Participatory approach and awareness raising

Graine de Vie places local communities at the heart of its work by developing projects that are designed and implemented directly within villages. Working closely with municipal authorities, traditional leaders, and local associations (women, farmers, schoolchildren), our organization supports initiatives led directly by the communities. This participatory approach enables residents to play a central role in the reforestation and sustainable management of their environment.

Graine de Vie supports this dynamic by creating and maintaining nurseries that produce 10,000 cash crop and forest tree seedlings annually, intended for both reforestation and resource production. These seedlings are distributed free of charge to families who commit to their long-term care and growth. By 2025, nearly 80,000 families benefited from this program.



## Inclusive and gender-responsive approach



Aware of the social impact of our projects, Graine de Vie adopts an inclusive approach, with a particular focus on gender equality.



Women play a central role in the implementation and oversight of our initiatives. Their involvement strengthens social cohesion, knowledge transfer, and the sustainability of initiatives. We are convinced that effective reforestation is based on equity, collective participation, and local capacity building.

## Awareness

Awareness-raising is a key pillar of Graine de Vie's work.

Through local exchanges and regular campaigns, we inform communities about the consequences of deforestation on access to wood, water, and food.

By mobilizing all generations, these actions raise collective awareness and encourage a lasting commitment to environmental preservation. More than 200,000 people were directly affected by our awareness-raising initiatives in 2025.



This approach also helps to strengthen the resilience of territories in the face of climatic and human pressures, in particular through the implementation of measures to prevent bush fires. Graine de Vie supports local communities in creating and maintaining firebreaks and protection zones around reforested plots.

# OUR ACTIONS

## Carbone certification

Carbon certification provides sustainable financing for reforestation initiatives while generating income for local communities.

This financing supports integrated development projects (sustainable agriculture, access to water, education, health) that contribute to preserving natural balances and strengthening the ecological stability of the regions.

Several projects are currently undergoing certification in Madagascar, Cameroon, Benin, and the DRC with our 10,000-hectare planting program in Moba.



## Direct seeding reforestation

Graine de Vie developed this method, which involves selecting, collecting, and processing seeds before planting them directly in the soil at the start of the rainy season.

We use this technique to carry out large-scale reforestation operations. This allows us to quickly restore large areas at a lower cost, while ensuring a high success rate.



## Restoration and protection of protected areas

National parks, special reserves, classified forests, and sacred forests are essential hubs of biodiversity and play a key role in the ecological continuity of landscapes. Their protection and restoration are an absolute priority.

In collaboration with local stakeholders, such as Madagascar National Parks and traditional leaders in Benin, Graine de Vie contributes to the preservation of this natural heritage. Projects include forest restoration within protected areas and the creation of nurseries in surrounding communities, strengthening both biodiversity conservation and the livelihoods of local populations.

These actions also contribute to the fight against climate change by promoting carbon sequestration and ecosystem resilience. They are part of a sustainable approach combining nature protection, local development, and the transmission of environmental knowledge.

## Restoration and protection of mangroves

Mangroves, located at the interface between land and sea, play an essential role in the proper functioning of coastal ecosystems.

They provide key habitats for many species and ensure ecological continuity between terrestrial and marine environments.

By supporting small-scale fishing and improving the quality of fishery resources, they contribute directly to local food security.

They also protect coastal villages from erosion and cyclones, while being among the most efficient ecosystems in terms of carbon sequestration.

To date, Graine de Vie is leading more than 30 mangrove restoration projects, helping to strengthen the environmental and economic resilience of coastal communities.






